Created by the son of Russian new comers to Israel, *10 Weitzman Street* was Tavger's first short film, completed in 2006. The talented TAU Film and Television graduate is also a practicing actor.



DARK NIGHT

Two Israeli soldiers take refuge in a Palestinian couple's house after their jeep is blown up in hostile territory. As the night progresses, the situation becomes more desperate.

Directed by Leon Prudovsky

St. Petersburg native Prudovsky's TAU project was nominated for an American Student Film Academy Award in 2005, and won awards at festivals including Venice, Beijing, Palm Springs, and Bucharest.
